

## Reading Checklist

- Get a local library card, and visit the library on a regular basis.
- Read books, magazines, and newspapers.
- Read material that interests you.
- Read web or print articles related to the four TOEFL subject areas of life science, physical science, social science, and arts.
- Read easy material such as simplified novels. Work on increasing your reading speed. Time yourself, and keep track of how many words per minute you read.
- Be sure to read information on the Internet in order to get used to reading text on a computer screen.
- Get Internet news delivered to your email inbox. For example, subscribe to news from USA Today, The Globe and Mail, or The Epoch Times.
- Get specialized news delivered to your email inbox. For example, get tech news at [www.cnet.com](http://www.cnet.com) or science news at [www.sciencedaily.com](http://www.sciencedaily.com).
- Read Internet news from your country in English. For example, go to the China Daily or Iran Daily website.
- Read articles on various e-zine websites such as Time, Newsweek, Business Week, Psychology Today, Popular Science, or National Geographic.
